New Year's Day — CREATION — Genesis 1

Creation was unlike any day in history. What a day it must have been! In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth. The earth was without form, and void; and darkness was on the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God was moving over the face of the waters. And God said, Let there be light; and there was light. God saw that day one "was good" and it was to be followed by five days in which it was good. On the day in which God rested from all His labors, He saw everything that He had made, and behold, "It was very good" Genesis 1:31. What a day of rest! What an amazing way to start a new year. New Year's Day — Salvation — Genesis 8:13

God had said, "The day you eat of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, you shall surely die," (Genesis 2:17).

Noah was born 1,056 years after the creation and by that time the

When he was 600 years old, the whole earth was destroyed by the flood. Noah and his family had been shut up in the ark for one year and ten days.

Genesis 8:13 "In the first month, the first day of the month... Noah removed the covering of the ark, and looked, and behold the face of the ground was dry."

The Bible tells us about the generation we are in.

New Year's Day — REDEMPTION — Exodus 12:2

Exodus 12:2 NKJV This month shall be your beginning of months; it shall be the first month of the year to you.

430 times Abraham's descendants had ended the year in bondage, but now they were going to have an entirely new calendar.

"Day One," was going to be the dawn of liberty from bondage.

God was going to break the back of their oppressors and they were going free. God was going to redeem them and the blood of the sacrifice lamb would be their covering. If they put their trust in the blood of the lamb, they would be redeemed. The high hand and strong arm of Jehovah was their might. The pillar of cloud and the pillar of fire would be their guide and protection. Canaan Land was their hope and promised home. They were to be redeemed from slavery and bondage into a land that flowed with milk and honey.

It is day one when we are redeemed.

Colossians 1:13-14 NKJV He has delivered us from the power of darkness and conveyed us into the kingdom of the Son of His love, in whom we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins.

When you are redeemed by the blood of Jesus Christ, the Lamb of God, you have reason to rejoice for you have been set free.

New Year's Day — Communion — Exodus 25:8

In Exodus 25:8 God said, "Let them make Me a sanctuary, that I may dwell among them."

Exodus 40:17, 34 NKJV And it came to pass in the first month of the second year, on the first day of the month, that the tabernacle was raised up.

"...then the cloud covered the tabernacle of meeting, and the glory of the LORD filled the tabernacle."

What a day for Moses and all Israel when God's glory was in their midst.

This may be your portion this new year.

In 1 Corinthians 6:19, you are told that "your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you." Do you understand the implications of what you are being told?

2 Corinthians 6:16 NKJV For you are the temple of the living God. As God has said: "I will dwell in them And walk among them. I will be their God, And they shall be My people."

This is a year for God to dwell among His people.

New Year's Day - Sanctification — 2 Chronicles 29:15-17

When King Ahaz was king, the doors to the house of the Lord had been shut up, (2 Chronicles 28:24). He had aligned himself and all Israel with the gods of the Syrians and had cut in pieces the articles of the house of God. Every high place in Judah had been made a place to burn incense

and worship other gods. After Ahaz died and King Hezekiah began to reign, the doors of the House of the Lord were opened and repaired, (2 Chronicles 29:3). Everything in the house of God needed to be sanctified. They carried much rubbish out of the Lord's dwelling place. It was a time of sanctification.

2 Chronicles 29:17 NKJV Now they began to sanctify on the first day of the first month, and on the eighth day of the month they came to the vestibule of the Lord. So they sanctified the house of the Lord in eight days, and on the sixteenth day of the first month they finished.

After they cleansed the Lord's house, the people with one heart began to cleanse themselves.

This New Year should be a year of cleansing the inner chambers of the temple of our lives.

We should get rid of every evil thought, envy, hatred, wrath, strife, or any filthiness of the flesh or spirit, (Matthew15:19; Galatians 5:20-21; 2 Corinthians 7:1). This is a year for returning to God and sanctifying our hearts for Him.

New Year's Day — Separation — Ezra 7:9

God's people had been exiled to Babylon because they had disobeyed His will. They had been exiled for nearly 2,000 years. On new year's day they began leaving Babylon.

Ezra 7:9 NKJV On the first day of the first month he began his journey from Babylon, and on the first day of the fifth month he came to Jerusalem, according to the good hand of his God upon him.

From Babylon to Jerusalem was about 520 miles but they had to make many detours on account of the enemy, so they traveled some 900 miles. By the good hand of God, they came to Jerusalem. It took 5 months and many trials to arrive. The enemy of our souls has made terrible advances against many of our lives. He wants to keep us from enjoying the blessings that God has prepared for us in Christ. He has come against us like a roaring lion and with numerous and mighty attacks.

We have obeyed the call of God and we are looking for "a city which has foundations, whose builder and maker is God," Hebrews 11:10

You need to know that the time for coming up and out is at hand. This is a new year for rejoicing in victory over each trial as we journey home.

New Year's Day — Glory

Revelation 21:5 And He that sat upon the throne said, "Behold, I make all things new."

Think about this — all things new! There will be new heavens and a new earth. All of the old things are passed away, and behold ALL THINGS WILL BE MADE NEW!!! There will be no more tempter, deceiver, or satanic powers. There will be no more death, sorrow, pain, tears, or curse.

Revelation 21:4-5 NKJV And God will wipe away every tear from their eyes; there shall be no more death, nor sorrow, nor crying. There shall be no more pain, for the former things have passed away." Then He who sat on the throne said, "Behold, I make all things new."
